- State Government's Emergency Relief Plan.




Foodbank Victoria 4 Year Strategic Plan

What is Breakfast Club?

Breakfast Club enables all students at school to enjoy a nutritious breakfast, allowing them to engage and participate fully in all the educational and social opportunities that school offers. In addition to breakfast foods, the School Breakfast Clubs Program also offers lunch supplies and home food packs to students in need.

Lunch Supplies

The Lunch Program supports students who may not have access to a sufficient or nutritious lunch. Providing lunch items at school enables students in need to concentrate and participate effectively in the school day.

Home Food Packs

The Home Food Packs Program supports students who may not have enough food or access to nutritious food at home. Home Food Packs can be provided throughout the school term or school holidays.

Mobile Markets

Farms to Families:

Fresh produce market feeds 200 families with 10-12 kilograms of fresh fruit and vegetables.


Mobile Supermarket:

20-meter articulated bus. Feeds 100 families each visit: 2,000 kgs food: pantry staples, fresh produce, frozen, and chilled products.



Foodbank in Melton

- Currently work with 36 partners in the Melton.
- 25 Schools
- 11 Charity Partners
- Delivered over 355000kg Year To date = 639,000 meals.
- Delivering Mobile Markets Farms to Families' market.
- Developing new partnerships within Melton



How we operate in Melton

- We support organisations who feed the community on a large scale. Foodbank partners with organisations in Melton who distribute anywhere between around 4000kg to 90,000kg a year.
- Our largest distributor in Melton is ADRA Melton who have distributed over 85,000kg this financial year, ADRA provide a food hamper collection service to over 200 families every Friday.
- Although our smaller distribution partners collect their orders from our Yarraville warehouse, we are able to support our larger volume programs with a direct delivery.
- School Breakfast Club Program participants

receive their orders via direct delivery - no matter how big, small or frequent.

- Foodbank distributes food through registered partners who are provided with access to an online portal.
- The food we receive and distribute (non-School Breakfast Club) is approx. 30% purchased and 70% donated goods - which is managed by best before and use by guides and attracts a small handling fee.

Foodbank's future direction

- Increase food distribution across Victoria.
- Community Food Centres in Ballarat and Morwell.
- Developing relationships with non-traditional partners like Western Health and Neighbourhood Houses across Victoria to reach more communities experiencing food insecurity.



- Secure funding to develop innovative programs that support specific communities and cohorts.
- Build relationships between schools and food relief programs





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
